## CPA UK: RULES: EXPLANATORY NOTE ON PROPOSED CHANGES, JUNE 2019

The substantive changes are in the following four areas:

- Membership of Executive Committee
  - Existing paragraphs 15 and 16 provide for <u>annual election</u> of members to the Executive Committee
  - New paragraph 7 would give effect to the Exec proposal to change this to the Committee being <u>elected after a General Election and serving until the next General</u> <u>Election is called and Parliament is dissolved</u>.
- Chair, Treasurer and Vice-Chairs of the Executive Committee
  - Existing paragraphs 11 and 12 are <u>inconsistent</u> on election and tenure of the Chair and Treasurer roles. Para 11b provides for annual election; para 12 says their term will be for the period of the "fixed term" (sic) parliament. In addition, para 12 also says neither office-holder may be re-elected to their office during the term of the subsequent Parliament.
  - New para 8 would make clear that <u>the tenure in either Post is from election at the Exec following the General Election until the following General Election is called;</u> and also give effect to the Exec proposal to <u>allow a Member to seek re-election</u> to these Posts following a General Election.
  - New para 8 would also give the three Vice-Chairs similar tenure, as opposed to annual election as at present.
- Removal of "Associate Member" category; and of offices of Vice-President and ex-officio Chair of the Branch
  - Existing paras 5 and 6 create a category of Associate Member, potentially open to: all former Members; to former Members of other CPA Branches now resident in the UK; and to staff of Parliament and of CPA UK. This <u>serves no apparent useful</u> <u>purpose</u>, while carrying some risk.
  - Existing para 10 creates the office of Vice-President, filled ex-officio by PM, Leader of the Opposition, Foreign and Development Secretaries and Members who have held a long list of similar existing and predecessor roles. This office is in abeyance and does not seem to be a useful one to retain.
  - Similarly, existing para 11a creates the office of Chair of the Branch, filled ex-officio by the Prime Minister. There seems little benefit in retaining this role, which is also sometimes confused with that of Chair of the Executive Committee.
- Smaller amendments to better reflect existing practice and/or as a consequence of changes above.
